




AIR HOCKEY

- HOSE & SPIGOTS Don't forget to shut off your hose when finished watering your plants. Even a small drip can add up on the water meter.
- WATER SPIGOTS Please be mindful this summer as you water plants or trees to not let your water spigot run. Anyone using excessive amounts of water are subject to additional surcharges.
- <u>AIR CONDITIONING</u> If you are running your AC, try to keep your windows closed to be most efficient.
- <u>CORRAL</u> Be sure to read the sign when dumping back in the corral. There is a bay for GARDEN TRIMMINGS and a separate bay for TREE TRIMMINGS. The village will not take the tree trimmings if garden trimmings are mixed in.
- NO PARKING IN THE GRASS Fairlawn takes great pride in keeping the lawns beautiful, parking in the lawns deteriorates the grass and leaves ruts that are unattractive and difficult to repair.

Joan & JR moved to Fairlawn in 1989 (35 years) after hearing of Fairlawn Independent Living through their church. Joan was very specific with CC Schrock about what she was looking for. Joan explained that her lot was to be a quadplex of houses, but after CC talked to the board, it was decided to continue building duplexes. "At that time this was one of the bigger lots and homes being built." Joan loves her home and gave so many details of the updates she had made to it; from her landscaping to the carpet she selected, and the direction the house faced to get the best sunlight in her sunroom.

Joan & JR call their hometown Wauseon and Delta, respectively. JR owned a trucking company, J Squared Inc., which had nine trucks in the fleet hauling steel to Detriot.

Joan worked for the Bureau of Unemployment Compensation as a claim's examiner. When retirement came both Joan and JR stayed highly active - and that has translated to their fit condition they still have in their 90's!

In their time at Fairlawn, they made several friends. Particularly they had a special relationship with Wilma Roth, Zelma Kauffman, and Eleanor McMunn. Joan & JR would often be there to lend a helping hand to Wilma or to visit and share in their friendship. Zelma, as most may have guessed, would always have her famous homemade candy to share. When asked if there was any staff that stood out to them or had more of a special place in their hearts, Joan and JR both agreed that Wayne Short and Speed Beck from maintenance were their absolute favorites!

In closing the interview, we asked what they will miss the most? Joan said she will miss the peaceful community and above all, the people, "everyone here is so friendly and kind." JR said he will miss sitting on the front porch waving to everyone that went by and he said he will miss his London Plane Trees he planted several yeas ago in the front yard.

Fairlawn is honored to have been home to the Vance's for so many years. Their positive attitude, kind nature, and cheerful outlook on life is one that we can all look to as an example. Several Ash trees have been removed from campus due to the Emerald Ash Borrer bug that has destroyed these beautiful trees. Years ago an initiative was started to replace these trees. The trees donated to the campus are intended to be in memory of a loved one. Fairlawn has chosen 4 options to choose from to replace the beloved Ash. Pictures of these beautiful tree options can be found in the lobby of Wyse Commons. If you wish to sponsor a tree, simply fill out the form (also located in Wyse Commons). Complete the form and return payment to Fairlawn and the order will be placed. All trees will be planted in the fall of 2024 for best results.

<u>Option # 2</u>

Valley Forge Elm
Valley Forge American Elm is a
large-maturing shade tree with a
dense canopy of dark green leaves

and the graceful arching habit.
This deciduous tree typically grows to 60-80 feet tall with a broadrounded crown. It is native to eastern and central North America. Non-showy, small green


flowers appear in spring before the foliage emerges. Leaves typically turn yellow in fall. 'Valley Forge' has excellent resistance to Dutch

elm disease.

Option #3

Northern Pin Oak The Northern Pin Oak is native throughout North & North-Central America. It's a stately medium to large tree for yards with plenty of sun. Northern Pin Oaks will grow to be about 60 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 50 feet, with a lovely oval-shaped crown that provides plenty of shade as the tree matures. The leaves of Northern Pin Oak are a darkish green and the fall color is a deep redrusset, turning brown as the season advances.







<u> Option # 1</u>

Sun Valley Maple
The Sun Valley Maple is a
showy fall-coloring accent tree
for the home landscape,
featuring an upright oval
habit of growth, attractive red
flowers in early spring, and
brilliant red foliage in fall. It
grows more slowly, and it
matures between 20 and 35
feet tall with a spread of 15-25
feet. And yes! It is seedless!!



Option # 4

Spring Snow Crabapple (Ornamental) This Spring Snow crabapple provides fragrant, white blooms in the spring and stunning yellow foliage in the fall. It's also fruitless, saving you the clean-up time required for traditional crabapple trees. This

variety's dwarf size also makes it a fantastic choice for smaller spaces.
