The Wellness Services Program is designed to enhance the quality of life for our residents! This program allows you to remain in the Independent Living setting safely and longer. These fee-based services are to provide you with additional support within your home. With a wide variety of services available to you, we are ready to meet your needs and lend a helping hand.

SERVICES & PRICING:

Medication Box set up:

- Once a week medication box Check: restocking
- \$30/week

Medication reminders:

- · we all forget things now and then, let us remind you to take those medications
- \$40/month

Blood Pressure/Vital Sign

- As needed blood pressure
- and vital signs checked
- \$15-\$30

Housekeeping:

- light house cleaning, such as sweeping, moping, bathroom cleaning, dishes
- \$25/hour

Linen and Laundry Services:

- Bedding changes, laundry washing and folding
- \$25/hour

Meals:

 \$6 per meal/includes delivery if requested

Errands:

Pricing varies per errand

Help Feed the Kids

The "Snack Sisters", is a group within the nonprofit Shepperd Circle and they are hoping to partner with the residents of Fairlawn to help feed the students of the local IEC school. The IEC school has children going home for the weekend with not enough or in some cases any food for the weekend.

The Independence Education Center (IEC) is a self-contained building for students at the K-12 level who require intensive behavioral support to meet their educational goals. The school services many of the local schools in northwest Ohio, including the Bryan school district.

This school year they have fifty plus students registered. The goal is to provide a "snack pack" available to every student who wishes to take one home on Fridays.
